 Grade 3 Assessment Results are in English and French Immersion students both wrote the Math assessment. Results were very good with only a few students not meeting.

English students wrote the Literacy assessment. Overall results were good, but we did have a group of students not meeting. Most kids who did not meet had already been identified and have plans in place.

A meeting will be held with all Grade 4 teachers and the teachers who support those classes to ensure that things are in

		place for those students who did not do as well as we would like We collected data from all P-5 class teachers indicating if students were meeting expectations in Literacy and Math at the end of September. Those results showed that we have lots of work to do now that school is back in session. Similar results will be collected from teachers at the end of every month so that we can track our progress.
