Dear KWE Families,

The safety and security of our students and staff is a top priority for **Kingswood Elementary School** and the Halifax Regional Centre for Education. We have been implementing a number of measures as part of a comprehensive plan aimed at ensuring our school remains a safe place for our students to learn.

Next week, our school will be practicing the lockdown drill. During a lockdown drill, classroom doors are secured, and the students remain inside the room out of visibility until instructed by the teacher to resume their activities. All exterior doors are locked, and no one is permitted to enter or leave the building.

We also practice a Hold and Secure that is similar to a lockdown drill, but students remain in the classroom performing normal activities. Students are kept inside the school and classrooms when circumstances make it safer to stay in the classroom rather than evacuate. This drill will take place the week after the lockdown drill

Just as we prepare our students to properly respond to a fire drill, they also need to be aware of the proper response during a lockdown/hold and secure drill. These drills should be treated with the same level of importance as fire drills.

Please be assured that staff at our school will spend time discussing the importance of this procedure with students in an age-appropriate manner prior to running a drill. We will also take time after the drill to remind them that it was only a practice and there was no danger. When possible, our School Liaison Officer may assist us in conducting the lockdown drills just as the Fire Department assists with evacuation drills.

Please take the time to speak with your child about this procedure and reinforce its importance. We practice these drills to ensure our school remains a safe place for teaching and learning.
