The SAC met seven times during the school year. At each meeting we received a report from the Principal containing information on enrollment, events that had happened, events that were planned, how the students were doing towards meeting the school’s SSP goals and any new business that sitting members wanted to bring up.

Members participated in a survey for action to increase physical activity in all students. Lots of feedback was given.

We engaged in many discussions regarding the overcrowding at the school and sent letters to the HRCE requesting to know what the plan for the school was.

After the decision for Grade 5 and Grade 6 English students to move to RLE was we were informed of all the work that the school was doing to transition the students to their new schools.

We continued to work with our ERS Committee to obtain funds for a new bike rack as well as improving the safety for our walking students around the school grounds.

The school and SAC have a partnership with Parachute Canada. We established an ERS (Elementary Road Safety) Committee. We were not successful in getting some of the infrastructure that we want for the school, but we did manage to get an additional bike rack and we had some painting done around the Kiss and Go and the bus loop to help students stay in a safe area when walking.

We were successful in getting 14 picnic tables installed outside of the portables. These are being well used.

Students made great gains in Literacy and Math. The school also did lots to support our students' well-being.
